## **Introduction**

The Quarterly Briefing shall provide the Board of Trustees with a set of periodic reports and performance indicators designed to give an overview of the University's major goals and achievements in academic affairs, faculty and student body demographics, research, economic development activities, facilities development, institutional advancement, and financial management.

The Quarterly Briefing will be updated as necessary and distributed to the Board of Trustees prior to each of its quarterly meetings.

## **Notes and Highlights**

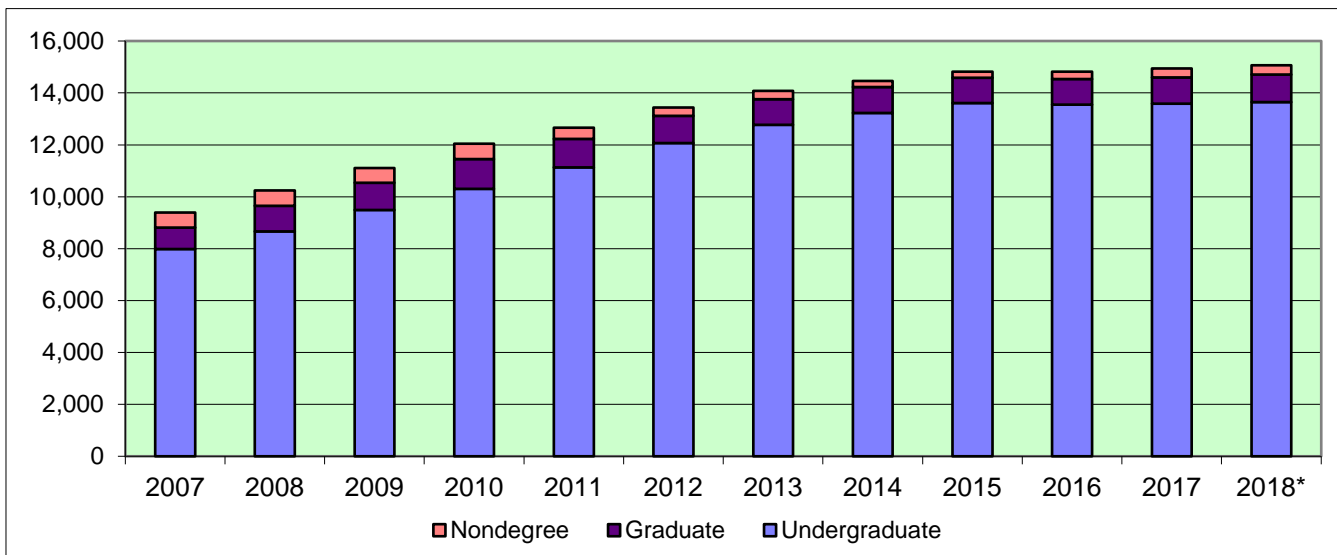
- The preliminary fall 2018 headcount enrollment was 15,067, 0.8% above fall 2017.
- The final 2017-18 annual fundable FTE is 9623, or 2.3% ahead of 2016-17.
- The preliminary number of new freshmen is 2903, or 10.6% above 2017-18.
- In 2017-18, approximately 2678 bachelor's degrees were awarded compared to 2399 in 2016-17.
- The number of master's degrees for 2017-18 was 287, compared to 286 in 2016-17.
- FGCU awarded 34 doctorates in 2017-18, bringing the total to 246.
- Undergraduates make up 91% of the total student population.
- Freshmen make up 21.7% of the student body.
- Among undergraduates, 80% are full time.
- Students 24 or under represent 84.3% of the student body. The fastest rate of growth is among students less than 20.
- Hispanic students make up 21% of the total student population, increasing 4.6% over last fall.
- Majors in the College of Arts and Sciences represent 38.4% of the student population.
- FGCU holds the highest employment rate among all SUS institutions. About 74% of bachelor's and 79% of master's graduates in 2015-2016 were employed the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2016.
- Section 4 has the 2018-19 Operating Budget. Tables 4.1 through 4.4 provide actual expenditures through 2017-18 and estimated budget for 2018-19.



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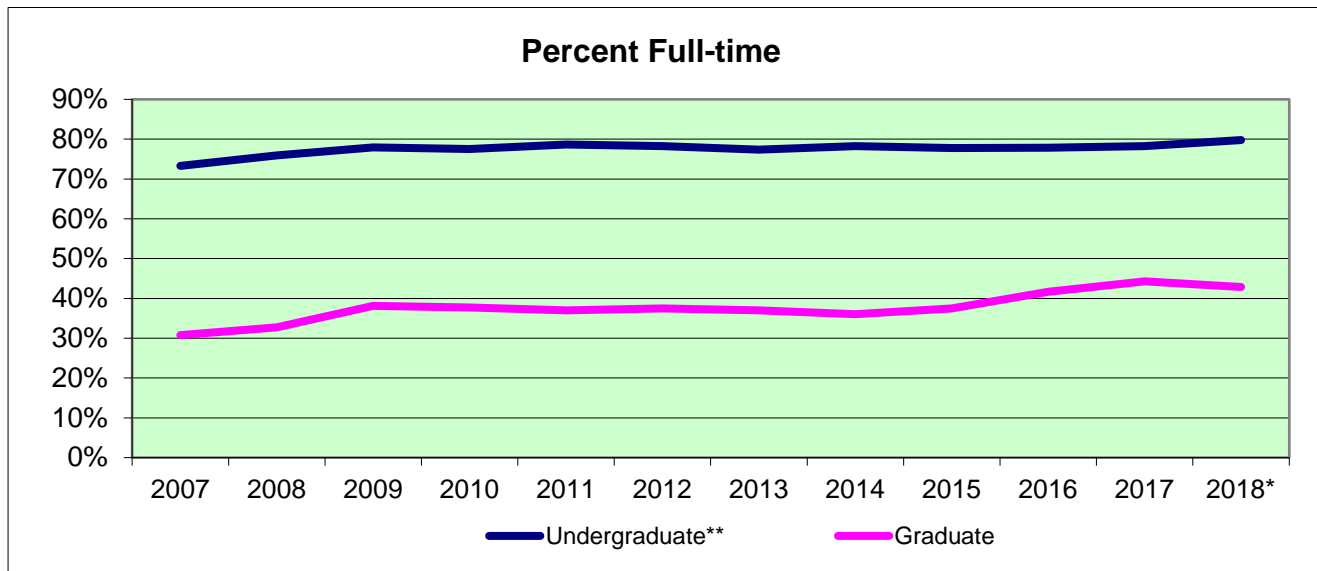

**Table 1.2 - Full-time Attendance by Level, Fall Terms**



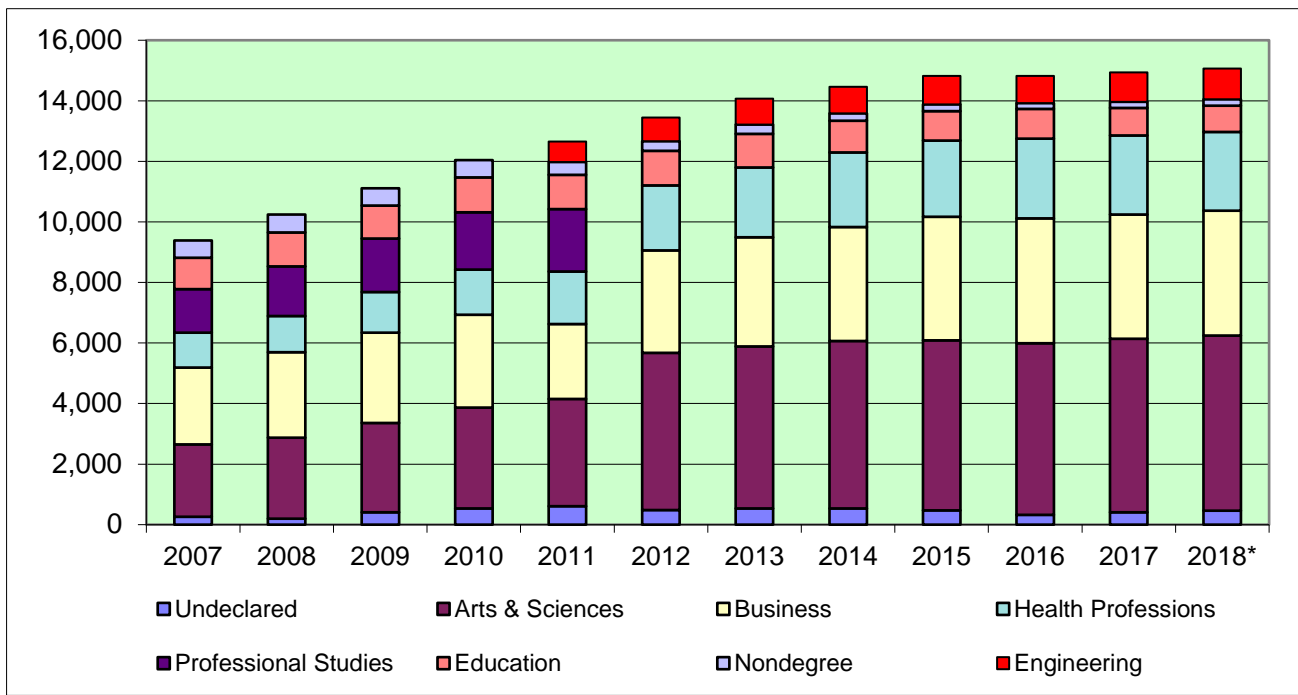

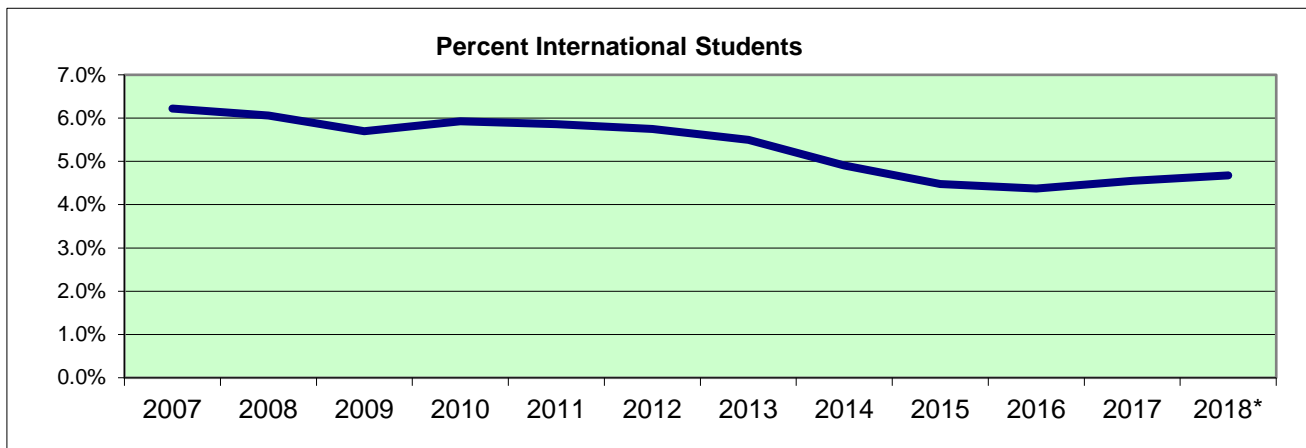

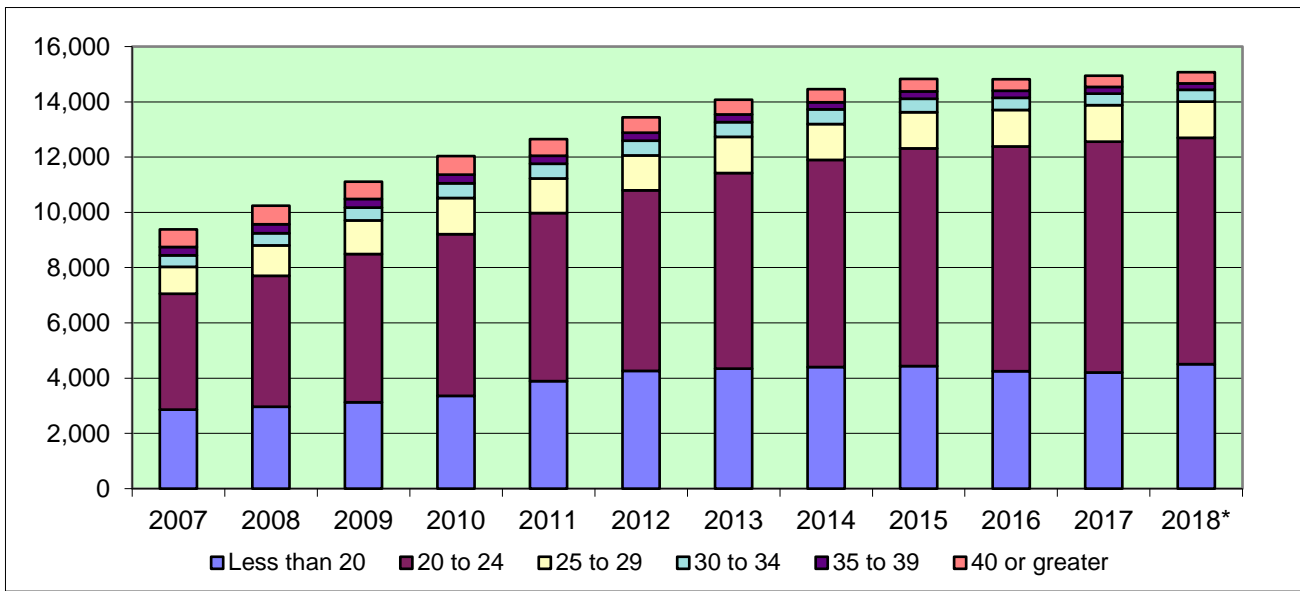

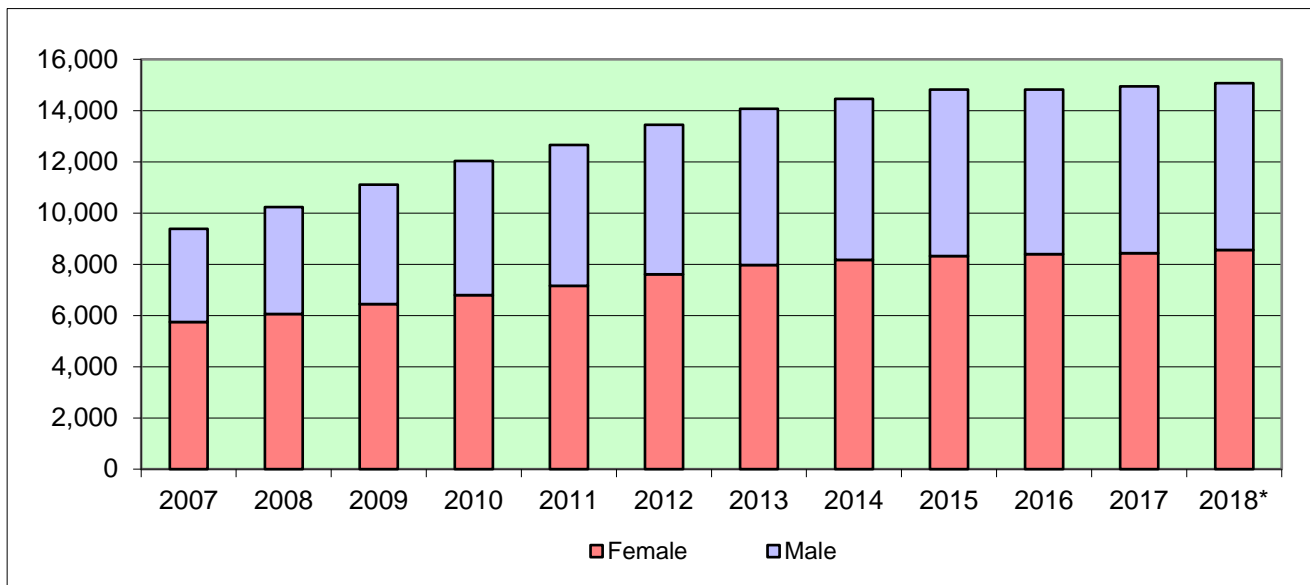

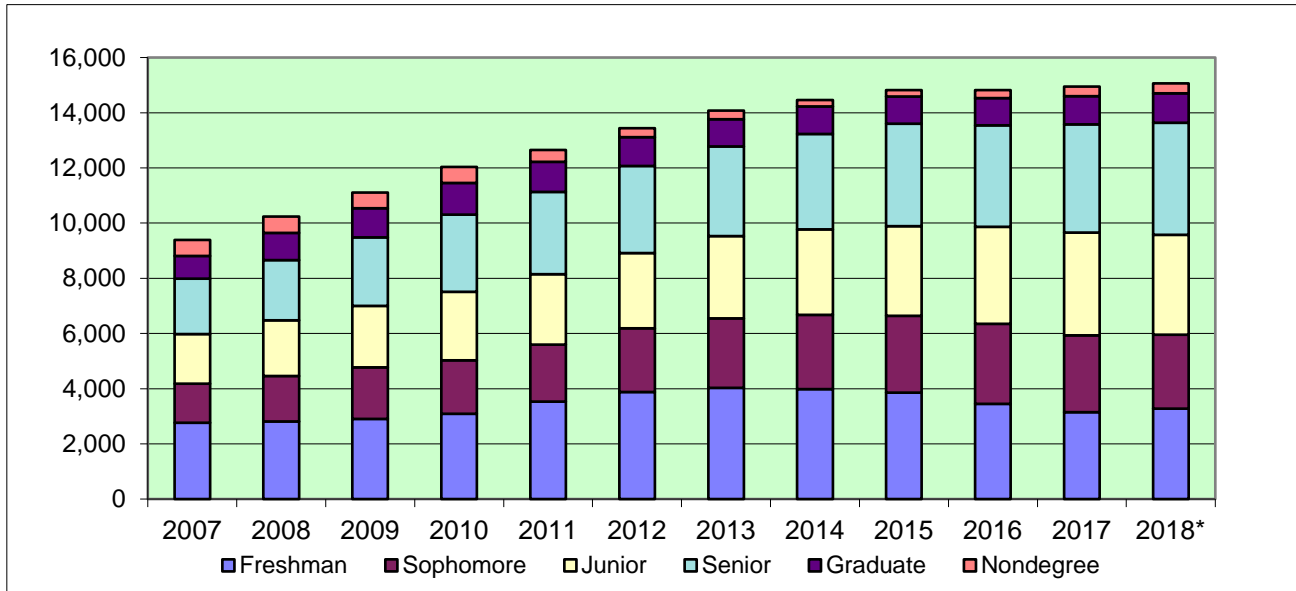

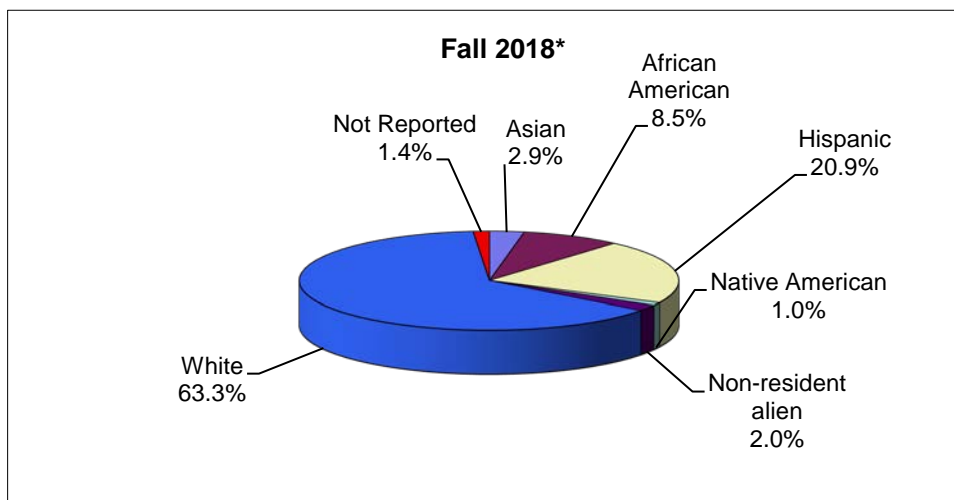

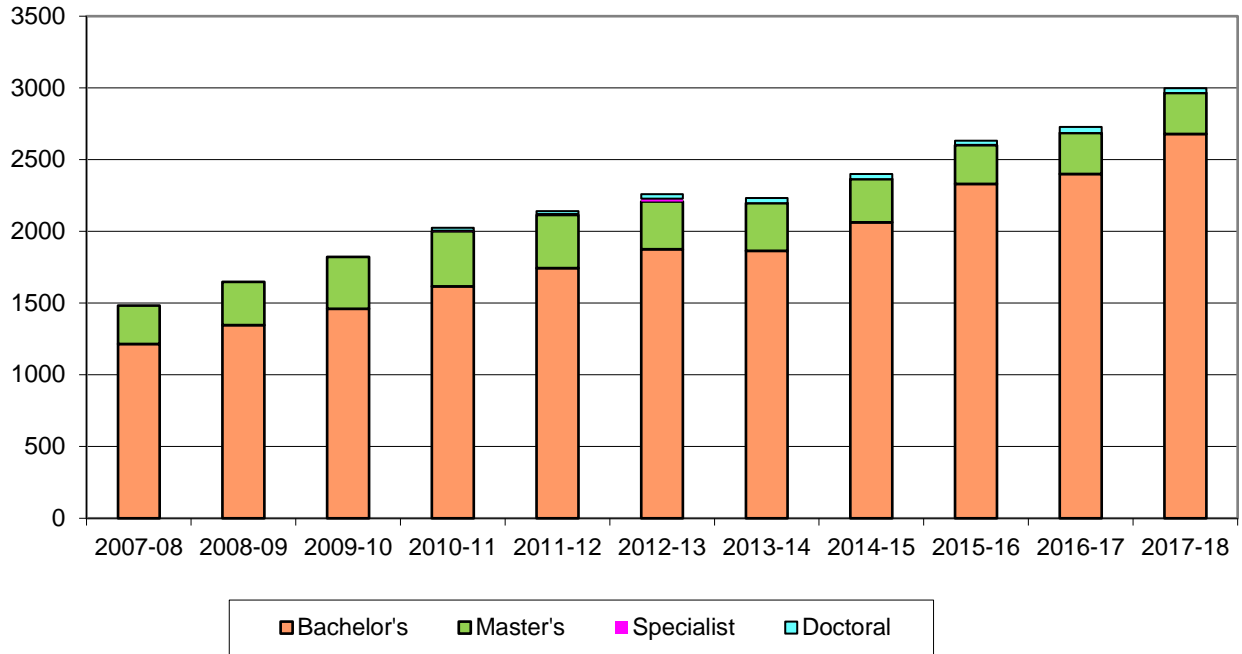

**Table 1.9 - Degrees Granted by Academic Year**



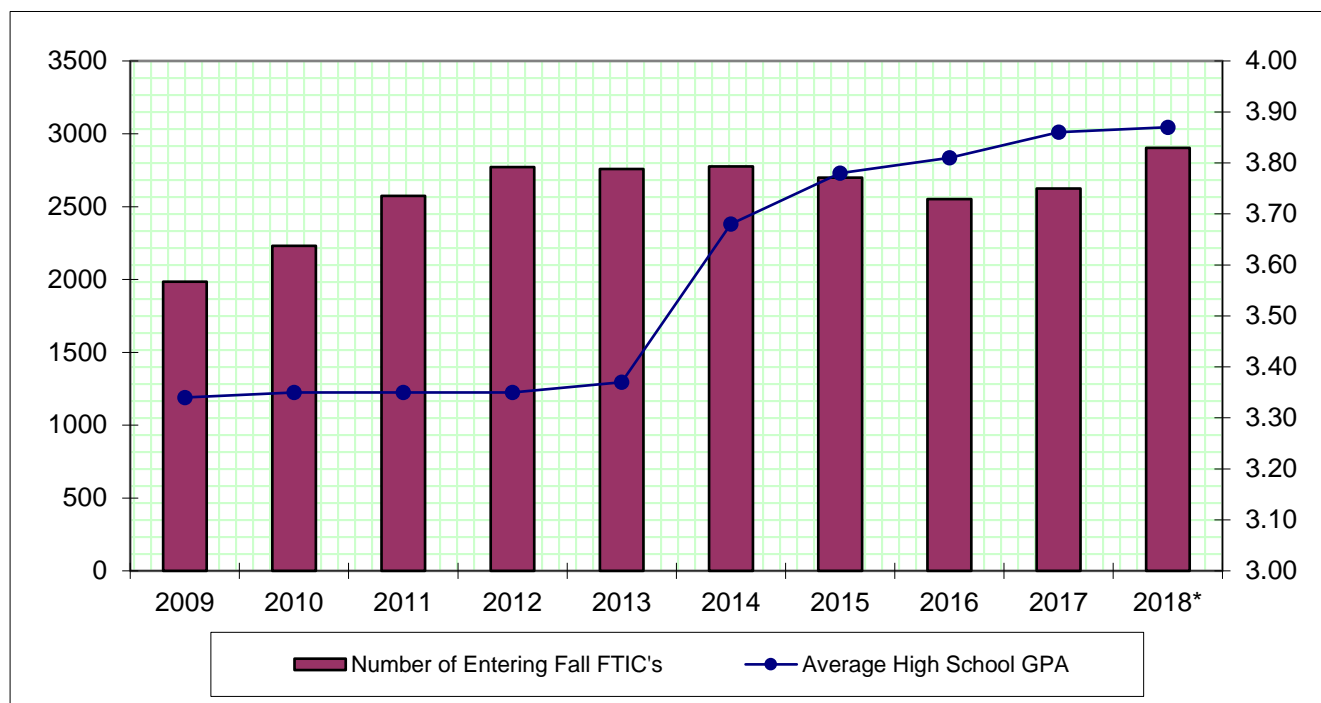

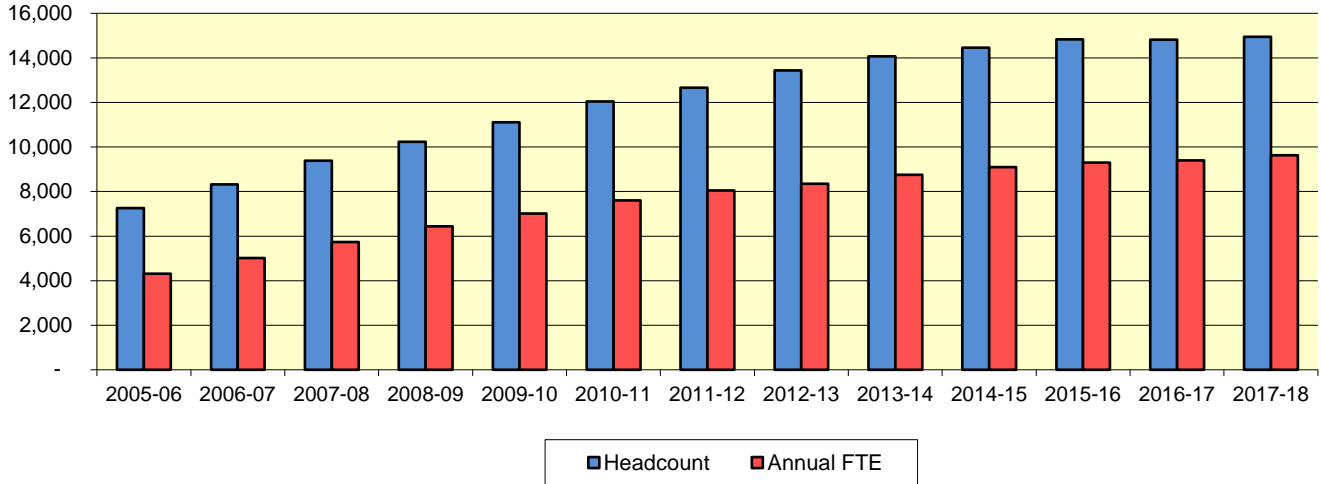

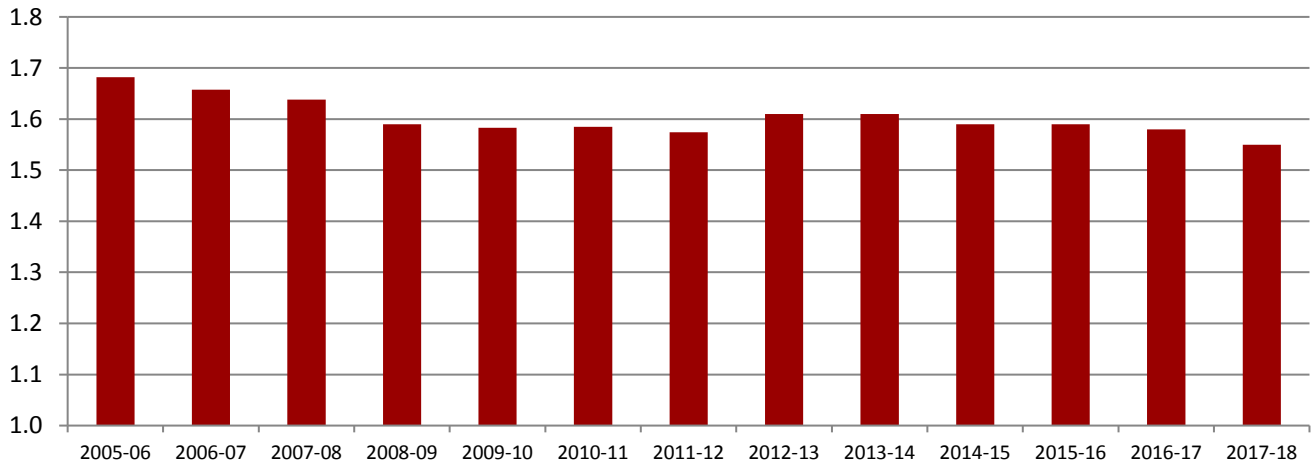

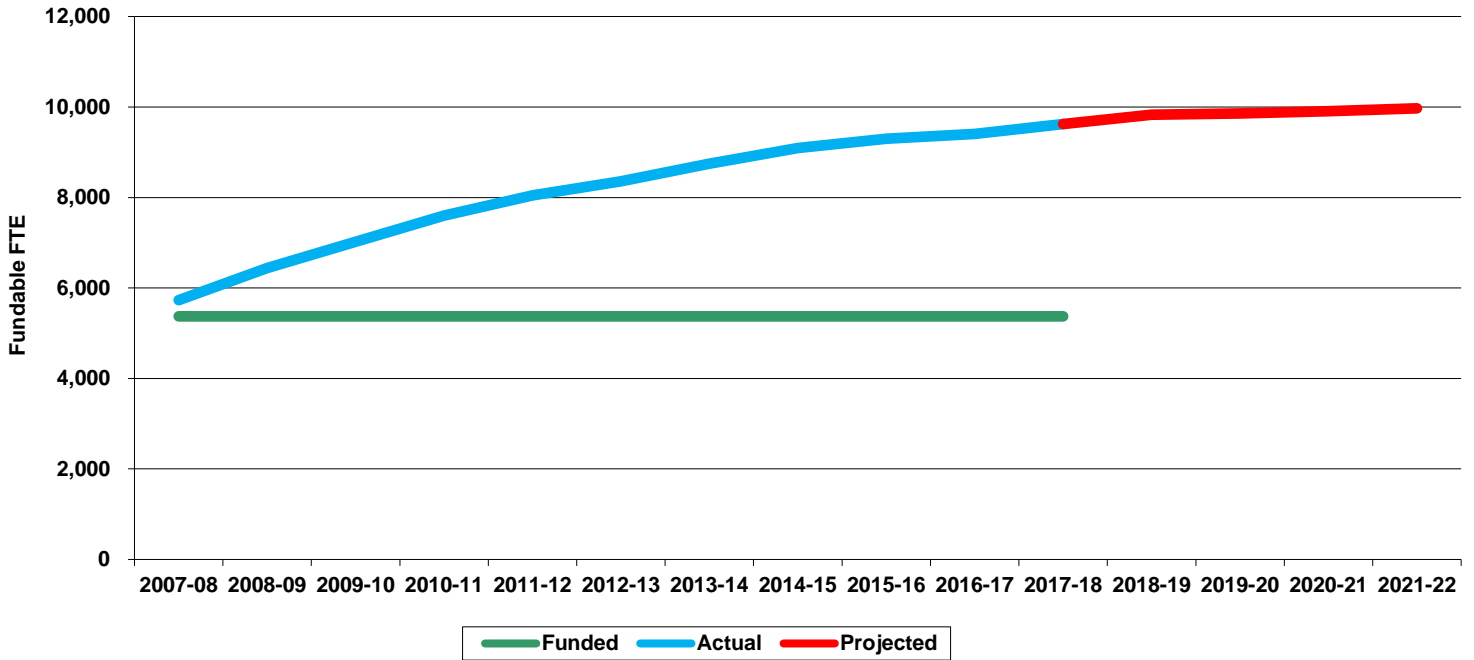

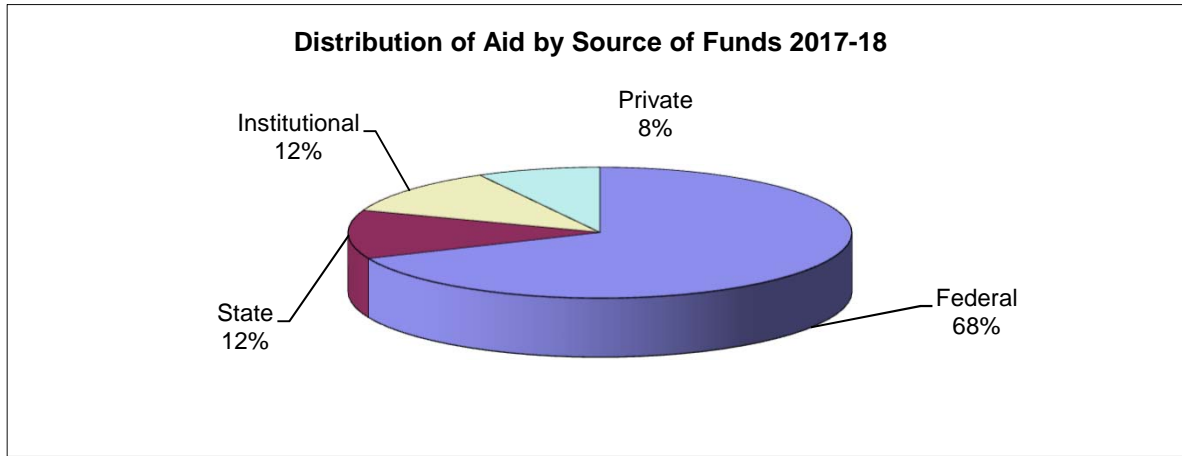

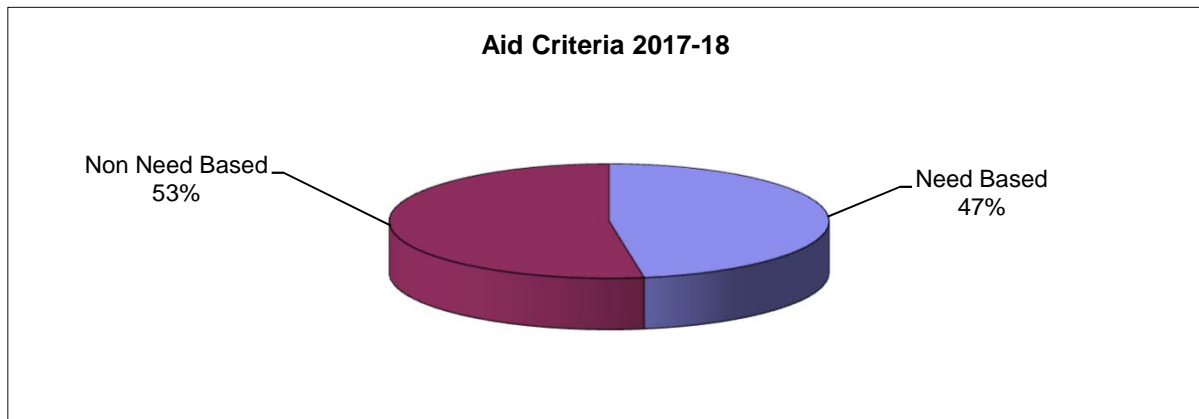

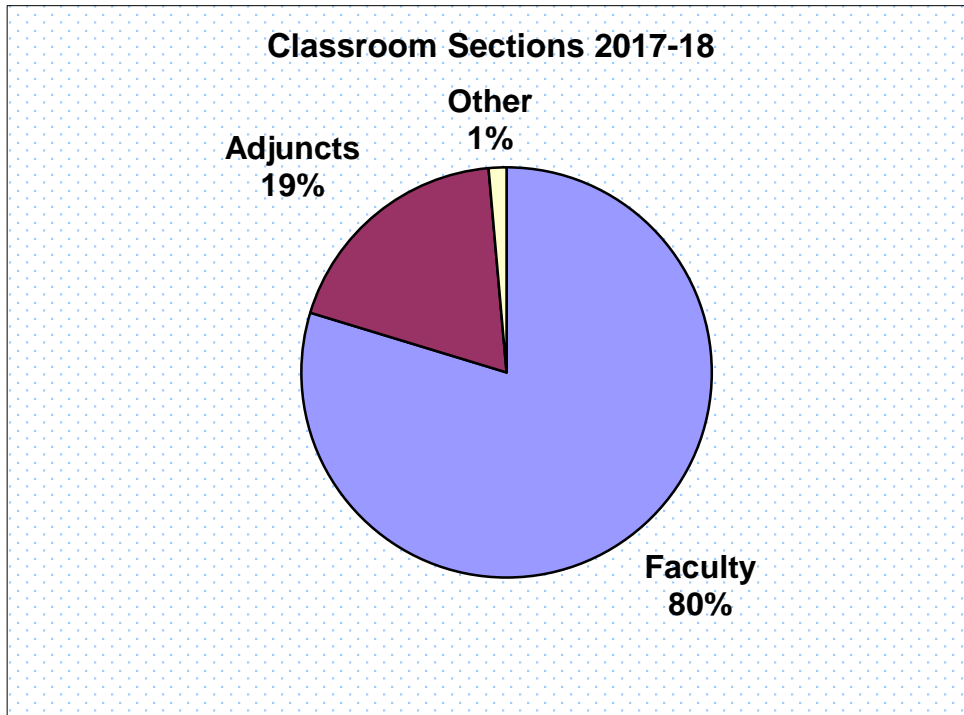

**Distribution of Classroom Sections by Faculty Type**

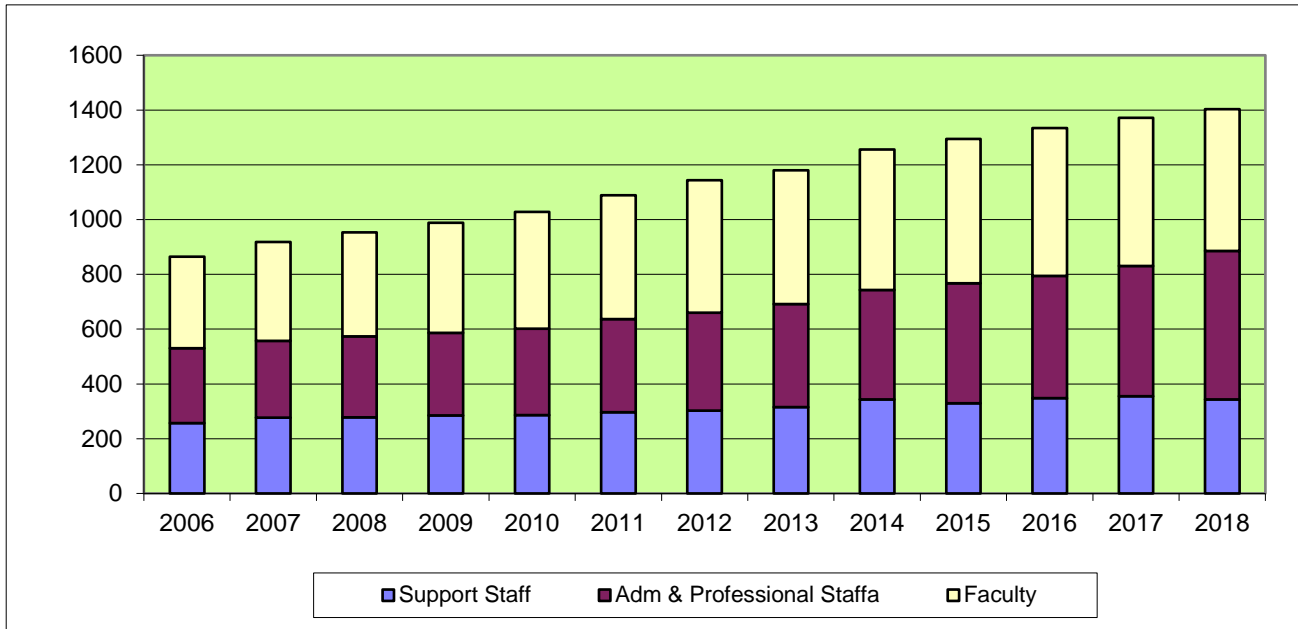

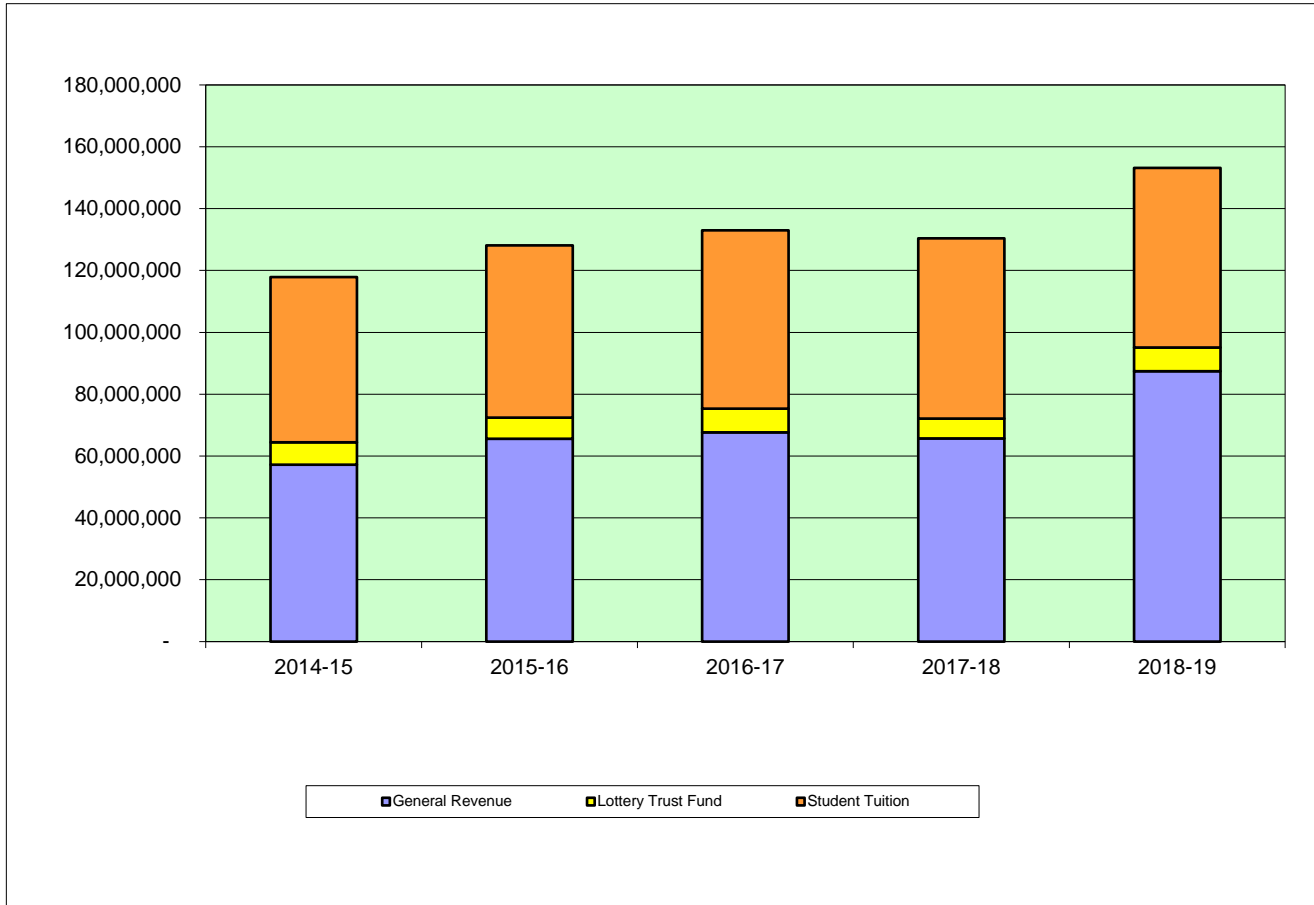
